Conversation with a Woman Leader —

Wendy Lehr discusses her career and the Twin Cities theater scene at Luncheon, February 5

Wendy Lehr has been an active member of our local theater scene for almost 50 years. She is perhaps best known for her long association with the Children's Theater Company where she was a member of the resident acting company from 1966–1986 and associate artistic director and director of Education from 1990–1998. During those years she not only appeared in hundreds of productions, but

she also directed and choreographed numerous shows and became a teacher of theater arts.

Wendy has performed at many local theaters including Guthrie, Jungle, Illusion, Ordway, History, Park Square, Jeune Lune, and Theater Latte Da. In addition, she has also directed several productions at Park Square Theater in St. Paul.

Nationally, Wendy has performed with the Arizona Theater Company, Lyric Opera Cleveland, Seaside Music Theater in Florida, and the Kansas City Reparatory. International credits include the National The-

ater of Hungary, the National Theater of Canada in Ottawa, The Stratford Festival in Canada, and Nissei Theater in Japan.

Her love of teaching inspired her to help found a charter high school, the St. Paul Conservatory for Performing Artists (SPCPA) where she was artistic director from 2005–2009. The SPCPA named the Lehr Theater in downtown St. Paul in her honor. She remains as a faculty member of MacPhail's Prelude Program. Wendy's awards include the Twin Cities Critic's Award (KUDO), the Sally Irvine award, and the 2110 IVEY Award for Lifetime Achievement.
