# Curator of marvelous children's book art exposes shocking injustice

Lisa Von Drasek, curator of the Kerlan Collection of Children's Literature at the University of Minnesota, will be our featured speaker at our 2018 Annual Meeting and Luncheon on Tuesday, May 15. In her presentation, "Arian Dewey, the Hidden Artist: No Credit, No Copyright, No Royalty," she will explore the surprising business, cultural, and personal background of Jose Aruego and




Arianne Dewey. This is the story of their creative partnership as makers of the art in best-selling children's books, such as the beautiful and groundbreaking *Leo the Late Bloomer*. You will be charmed by the archival materials the Kerlan Collection includes, even as you are shocked to learn that Ms. Dewey received no credit, no copyright, and no royalties on the first 10 prize-winning picture books that she produced.

Formerly the children's librarian of the Bank Street College of Education, Von Drasek was the teacher/librarian for pre-k through 8th grade and course leader for Children's Literature, Storytelling, and Children's Book Publishing 101 in the graduate school of education. While serving as director of Bank Street's Center for Children's Literature, she founded the Cook Prize, a children's choice award given for STEM books. Lisa is a frequent guest lecturer in story-telling and folklore, collection development, and services to children. She is as entertaining as you might expect a storyteller to be. Bring a friend who loves the arts, and introduce her to our club's members and great programs.

I am bursting with pride to report to you that the UMWC is a healthy organization...it possesses the attributes of leadership, volunteerism, participation, and, most importantly, growth. None of this would be possible without YOU, our members.

Hosting the Big Ten Conference of Women's Clubs last summer increased our visibility and stature among the 11 schools represented.

Although we increased the cost of our membership dues and general club program meetings, the attendance at our meetings has increased, and our treasury is once again healthy.

We raised the amount awarded for each of our scholarships from \$2,500 to \$3,000 this year and 44 undergraduate women were the recipients at our Fall Welcome and Scholarship event. Seven members contributed funding for the new One-Year Named Scholarship, and that number has grown to 10 scholarships for the 2018–2019 academic year.

We have grown in our relationship with the University of Minnesota Foundation office—our lines of communication are stronger and our endowed scholarship funding more transparent than ever!

Our website is starting to "come of age" — a new design will be launched this fall.

With our updated branding of the lady slipper logo which is now everywhere—we have become more visible. It's on the cover of our Directory, on our newsletters, on our notecards, on our calling cards and recruitment brochures, and on our tote bags, which members take everywhere they go in the community.

Growth does not take place by chance. It has been the work of many many dedicated, loyal, and hard-working members. Whether a UMWC Board member, an Interest Section chair, program coordinator, or a member of a committee, YOU have done an outstanding job this year to make all that growth happen.

As I near the end of my club presidency, I am thankful for all of you—the dedicated and talented women who comprise the UMWC. And I know that because of you, this organization will continue to grow.

# Scholarship Committee to begin work soon

The UMWC scholarship applications opened on April 2, 2018, for the academic year 2018–2019. Each scholarship is \$3,000. Students must have a sophomore, junior, or senior status in an undergraduate degree program on the Twin Cities or Rochester campus. The applicants must be full-time students during fall and spring semester; they must demonstrate financial need as determined by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); and they must maintain a 3.2 GPA or higher. Preference is given to female students. Applications will close June 29, and the selection process will be completed by August 1, 2018. The Scholarship Committee waits in eager anticipation to begin the selection process.
