

### We did it again

After another banner year, the fundraising committee is pleased to announce that we have raised more than \$152,000 to distribute to women scholars this fall. More than \$78,000 comes directly from the 165 UMWC members who contributed to this year's scholarship campaign. Included in that figure are 15 One-year Named Scholarships, which total \$45,000.

Our endowed scholarships, held and managed by the University of Minnesota Foundation, yielded another \$74,100, which includes a generous gift from an anonymous UMWC member. The bottom line: UMWC had \$15,250 more dollars to distribute for scholarships this year. That's an additional five scholarships for a total of 54 \$3,000 full and partial scholarships for the 2019–2020 academic year.
